Whether you're new to the workforce or considering making a career change, it's important to have a clear path in mind. Unfortunately, that isn't always easy. Culture is also among the important factors. The working environment, your co-worker, and the company leadership can all contribute to how much or little you enjoy a job. No matter how well a role seems to align with your career goals, it may not be smart to take the role if the culture isn't right for you.

Finally, be sure to consider the future of the profession to which you may be drawn. In our age of rapid technological advances, the world of work is changing constantly. To identify a professional with potential, look at current trends in the industry. If possible, talk to people operating in the field. They may be able to tell you how your chosen career is likely to change in the future.
